



"Old School" Crappie Fisherman Reveals Two Quick 'N Dirty Secrets For Getting The Big Ones To Bite Almost Instantly!

Dear Fisherman,

I'll tell ya, interviewing "Carlton The Crappie Fisherman" was probably one of the best hours I've ever spent on the phone.

Not only did he give me a boatload of easy – immediately useable tips for catching more crappie than 95% of the other guys – but he gave me a few lessons about life too. (I'll let you in on those in a future issue).

For now, I wanted to give you a quick "bulleted" summary of the techniques he reveals in the two interview clips. (This is for you guys that just want get right to the heart of everything, quick)

Interview #1: Jigging for "quick" strikes

1. This works best if you find a patch of lily pads during the spawn... when you find them, approach very quietly (of course)...
2. Make sure you have a white 1/8 ounce Peewino Alibi jig with chicken feathers...
3. Now, you want to jig it within the lily pads 1 inch above the water.
4. Ease it into the water, 6 inches, and then jig it again!
5. Next, ease it down all the way to the bottom, pull it up 6 inches and jig it again...
6. Finally, slowly pull it out of the water, and get ready to get your arm broken!
7. Now, repeat this process just 6 inches away from where you just did it, and you'll get another, and another, and another...fish that whole area 6 inches apart every time...here's why:
8. The crappie like this area for laying eggs (usually on a patch of underwater grass underneath lily pads and other spots... and the males will be fanning the area by waiting for the ladies to lay their eggs – and then the males will fan milt over them.

9. There will be a bunch of males protecting the area, all close together – and that’s why you need to fish this area completely, in 6 inch increments...there will almost always be a male just 6 inches to the left or right, doing the same thing!

Interview #2: The secret of the “anchor” (and how you can exploit it for instant crappie bites)

1. This secret is for use when there is an anchor nearby (with an anchor rope coming up, obviously).
2. Fact: Most crappie fishermen spend their time moving from one spot to another every 10 minutes if there are no bites... Fact: Carlton doesn’t – and he will typically triple the crappie catches the other guys are doing. Here’s how:
3. Cast toward the long rope of the anchor.
4. When it hits the water, try to bring it back real close to that anchor rope, popping it very gently. Reel it slow...just keep on reeling slowly.
5. Bang! You’ll pull them up fast and furious. The reason?
6. The crappie are using the anchor rope to shade their eyes for an attack point! Just sit there (while everyone else is spending their time moving around), and kill ‘em using that anchor rope technique.
7. Fact: Last time Carlton did this, he was with a buddy who was in another boat – and the guy refused to use Carlton’s technique – he was stubborn. At the end of 2 hours, this other guy pulled up 17 crappie. Carlton pulled up 45. Is this method effective? You tell me...

I hope you enjoyed the interview clips as much as I did making them. Carlton is quite a guy. I couldn’t thank him enough for spending time talking to me. When guys older than me talk, I listen – especially when they talk about fishing.
